

Call for Operating Grant Applications

The District of Carleton North has many non-profit organizations that provide foundational support in many communities in our area. The Council of the District of Carleton North recognizes the importance of these groups. With the adoption of the Community Investment Policy, the District of Carleton North Council can provide financial ability to recognize and support the ongoing efforts of these vital organizations. The Community Investment Policy provides three kinds of support: 1) Annual Operating Grant, 2) Sponsorship, and 3) In-Kind.

The Annual Operating Grant is open until February 25, 2024 to ensure funding is provided for organizations 2024 operating year. The Annual Operating Grant supports community-based organizations, tourism, recreation and cultural organizations for their programs and operating expenses.

Council will receive and review the applications for the Annual Operating Grant., and with the recommendation of the Director of Corporate Affairs.

2023 had 21 successful applicants, including several community centers: Lakeville Community Centre \$3,500; Mount Pleasant Community Centre \$3,500, Glassville Community Centre \$3,500; Upper Kent Rec Centre, \$3,500, Juniper Community Centre, \$3,500, Juniper Rec Centre \$3,500, Stickney Recreation Centre \$3,500, Lakeview Church Hall \$2,000, Bath Knights of Columbus \$3,500, and Florenceville Kin Club \$3,500.

Seven organizations in the Tourism, Recreation & Cultural sector were successful including: Florenceville Curling Club for \$5,000; Carleton Minor Hockey Association for an ice credit of \$2,500; Aberdeen Snowmobile Club for \$2,000; Valley Outdoor Centre for \$1,500; Carleton County Toy Run \$2,000; Andrew & Laura McCain Art Gallery \$10,000, Potato World \$10,000.

And finally, two educational organizations were recommended for their contributions to children's learning and were successful for \$500 to the Bristol Elementary School's sand pit roof project, subject to them raising the balance of the funds, and \$2,000 to the Imagination Library project.






