On May 6, 2023, Canadians celebrated the Coronation of His Majesty King Charles III. This historic event marked the first coronation of a sovereign of Canada in seven decades. To mark this milestone, a Canadian commemorative medal has been created and will be awarded to individuals of all ages and from all walks of life who have made a difference in their communities.

9. **NEW BUSINESS:**

1. Sports Wall of Recognition

The Sports Wall of Recognition Committee reviewed the nomination applications and made three recommendations to Council.

2. **Subunit Adjustments – Reeleder Court / Merger of Subunits (Glassville/Upper Kent)**

Subunits are a defined boundary to which a tax rate is established related to a level and definition of services received by residents. Occasionally, adjustments to subunits are required to ensure they align with the service levels and appropriate taxation rate for these services.

Subsequently, a new process to make adjustments to subunits has been developed to ensure residents are taxed appropriately for the services they receive. Upon review of these Subunits, the District of Carleton North is requesting the following changes be made.

- 1) Reeleder Court (Ward 2): There are three properties located at the end of Reeleder Court that are being taxed at Florenceville-Bristol Rates. We are requesting that these three properties be moved to Ward 2 to align with the rest of the homes on the street. (PANs: 06561517, 06561525 & 04044226).

- 2) Merger of Subunits: We are requesting to merge the local service district of Glassville into the local service district of Aberdeen. We are also requesting to merge the local service district of Upper Kent into the portion of the local service district of Kent.

MOTION: To approve the Subunit changes as presented. Moved by Councillor Watson, seconded by Councillor Oakes.

3. Award Route 105 Outfall Replacement to Dexter Construction Company Limited

The RFP for Route 105 Outfall Replacement was made available to the public May 2024. Dexter Construction Company Ltd. was the lowest bidder at \$123,045.00 plus HST \$18,456.75.
