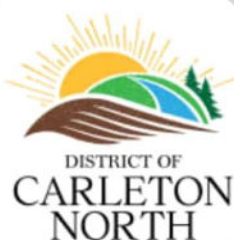
## Holiday Fun Recap and New Year Kick Off!

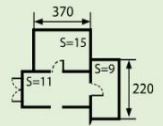

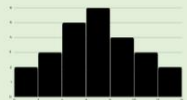

District of Carleton North Town Council is reviewing updates to the Bylaw Relating to Dog Control Bylaw No. S-3. The revised bylaw will cover the entirety of the District of Carleton North.

## Key Changes:

- Coverage Expansion: The Bylaw will apply to Bath, Centreville, Florenceville-Bristol and all former Local Service Districts.
- Animal Control Bylaws from Bath, Centreville and Florenceville-Bristol shall be repealed and no longer in effect.
- Enforcement: The SPCA shall enforce the Bylaw for the entire District.

## Council Readings:

- First reading took place on January 28
