



GARBAGE COLLECTION DAY

1. Everything possible must be boxed, bagged, tied or bundled to aid collection crews.

2. Max of 3 large items per household (plus regular garbage)

3. Tree cuttings must not exceed 4ft. or weigh over 50lbs. Securely tie in bundles, branches 2" diameter or less

4. Residential construction/demolition waste is no longer collected in Carleton County

5. No liquid waste of any kind (paint, solvents)

6. No motor vehicle parts

7. No propane tanks, other dangerous or toxic waste or tires of any kind

8. No appliances containing coolant (fridge, freezer, air conditioner, water cooler, dehumidifier)

Tires, Oil/Glycol, Batteries, Paint, Electronics, Tires, Paper and Packaging, Beverage Containers, Pharmaceutical Products and Medical Sharps can be RECYCLED all year

NHL LEGENDS GAME A HUGE SUCCESS AT NORTHERN CARLETON CIVIC CENTRE


The Northern Carleton Civic Centre was packed on Saturday, March 29, 2025 for the NHL Legends of Hockey Game. The event was born from a chance conversation between NHL Legends president Steve Walton and local Recreation Manager Jill Whitehouse.

Nine retired NHL stars, including Bernie Nicholls, Ron Duguay, and the Sutter twins, faced off against a Carleton North alumni team, winning 9–6 in a spirited matchup.

The evening featured announcer Liam Maguire, opening remarks from Mayor Andrew Harvey, a national anthem performance by the McAloon Sisters, and a ceremonial puck drop by local hockey advocate Chip Hunter. A 50/50 draw raised over \$1,250 for Carleton Minor Hockey.

Young local players who participated in a skills workshop earlier that day joined the legends on the ice during the second period for a special moment.

The night wrapped up with a Post Game Reception at the R.G. 'Bun' Veysey Active Living Centre, where fans met players and collected autographs. The event brought out hockey lovers of all ages united by a shared passion for the game and support for youth sports.



ICE REMOVAL PROCESS



DID YOU KNOW?

The ice surface is $1\frac{1}{4}$ - $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches thick. It takes 3 days to remove the ice. The process begins with turning the refrigeration plant off. Warm brine is pumped under the concrete slab to warm the ice. Once the ice has melted enough, a skid steer is used to break up the remaining ice into smaller and more manageable pieces for removal. The timing of the ice removal process is essential in reducing surface water and ensuring the skid steer operates as efficiently as possible to effectively clear the arena floor. Once the floors are squeegeed and scrubbed, the surface is ready for the next season of FUN!

OUR TEAM HARD AT WORK REMOVING THE ICE
