
# R.G. “BUN” VEYSEY ACTIVE LIVING CENTRE

As part of the celebration, the Public Art Plaque was also unveiled, providing visitors with insight into the meaning of the installation and the process from proposal to concept to completion.



## ICE INSTALLATION PROCESS

### DID YOU KNOW?



*THE ICE INSTALLATION PROCESS IN AN ARENA IS VERY DETAILED AND REQUIRES A LOT OF PRECISION AND PATIENCE. HERE'S A STEP-BY-STEP OVERVIEW OF HOW IT'S TYPICALLY DONE*

**PREPARING THE ARENA FLOOR** - The concrete slab which contains the arena's refrigeration piping is thoroughly cleaned. The refrigeration system is turned on to bring the concrete floor temperature down, usually to around -5°C to -8°C.

**CREATING THE BASE LAYERS** - A thin mist of water is sprayed over the entire floor, freezing almost instantly. This step is repeated 10 times to build up a smooth, even base (often just a few millimeters thick). Powdered white paint is mixed in a barrel and 3 coats are sprayed onto the frozen base to give its bright, reflective look. An additional 5-6 thin coats of water are applied over the paint to seal it.

**MARKING LINES AND LOGOS** - the faceoff circles, hash marks and goal creases are carefully painted by hand. The goal lines, red and blue lines and large circles are painted using a paint stick. This year the aesthetic appeal of a checkered pattern was chosen for the center line. Banners are mesh textile and frozen into the ice. All lines and logos are sealed using a back sprayer and many thin coats of water. This step ensures the paint does not run when applying additional seal coats.

**BUILDING UP THE ICE THICKNESS** - Two days are dedicated to walking the ice surface, applying fine misting coats building a strong, durable ice sheet.

**FINAL CHECKS** - Once the ice is thick enough, the ice building process is continued using the Zamboni machine. Temperature and thickness are checked to ensure the ice is consistent across the whole rink. The finished ice surface is 1.5 inches thick. Once complete, the arena is ready for the season.





The entire process from start to finish takes the Maintenance Team over a week to complete but the process isn't over.

**MAINTAINING THE ICE:** Daily maintenance is required throughout the entire season to ensure the thickness of the ice remains 1.5 inches



**NOVEMBER 3, 5, 6, 7  
REGULAR GARBAGE  
COLLECTION DAY**

1. Everything possible must be boxed, bagged, tied or bundled to aid collection crews.
2. Max of 3 large items per household (plus regular garbage)
3. Tree cuttings must not exceed 4ft. or weigh over 50lbs. Securely tie in bundles, branches 2' diameter or less
4. Residential construction/demolition waste is no longer collected in Carleton County
5. No liquid waste of any kind (paint, solvents)
6. No motor vehicle parts
7. No propane tanks, other dangerous or toxic waste or tires of any kind
8. No appliances containing coolant (fridge, freezer, air conditioner, water cooler, dehumidifier)

*Tires, Oil/Glycol, Batteries, Paint, Electronics, Tires, Paper and Packaging, Beverage Containers, Pharmaceutical Products and Medical Sharps can be RECYCLED all year*







ENACTED JUNE 24, 2025


