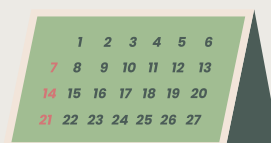

Our U7 clinics were instructed by Ted Deweyert, and focused on various hockey skills such as stick handling, puck control, and power skating.

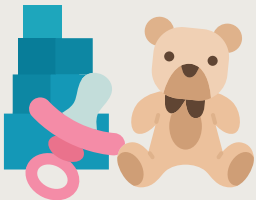
Pilot Days
